

Well Above Normal Temperatures Through Early Next Week

KEY POINTS

- Daily highs in the 90s across the lower deserts will put the area into the upper part of the minor HeatRisk category through at least Monday. Localized Moderate HeatRisk in SE CA Sunday.
Locally windy this evening in Imperial Co. Potential for breezy to locally windy conditions later next week.
Dry conditions to persist.
Cooling trend starting next Tuesday with near normal temperature returning later next week.

WEATHER RISK OUTLOOK

Risk levels incorporate potential impacts from weather hazards and likelihood of occurrence. The weather hazard with the greatest risk will be listed first in the matrix.

DETAILS

High Terrain SC AZ

**Impacts:**

Minor Risk for heat-related illnesses for those extremely sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Daily

- Valley highs in the mid to upper 80s through early next week with some locations topping 90° Sunday and Monday.
- Near normal temperatures returning by around Wednesday or Thursday next week.

Southwest Arizona

**Impacts:**

Minor Risk for heat-related illnesses for those extremely sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Daily

- Highs in the low to mid 90s each day through Monday with a few spots reaching into the upper 90s Sunday and Monday.
- Near normal temperatures returning by around next Wednesday.

Southeast California

**Impacts:**

Minor Risk for heat-related illnesses for those extremely sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Daily (Localized Moderate HeatRisk Sunday)

- Highs mainly in the mid 90s each day through Monday with some upper 90s on Sunday and Monday.
- Up to a 20% chance of reaching 100 degrees Sunday and Monday
- Near normal temperatures returning by around next Wednesday.

**Impacts:**

Loose or unsecured objects may be blown away.

Timing:

This Evening and potentially later next week

- Gusty winds up to 30-35 mph for parts of western Imperial County this evening.

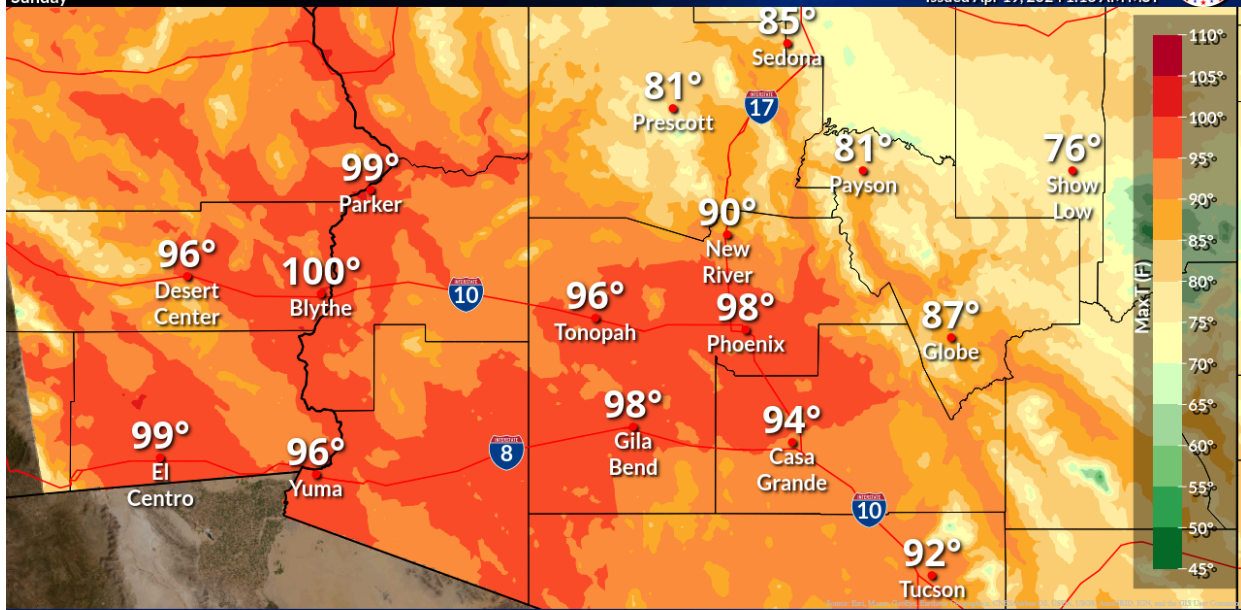

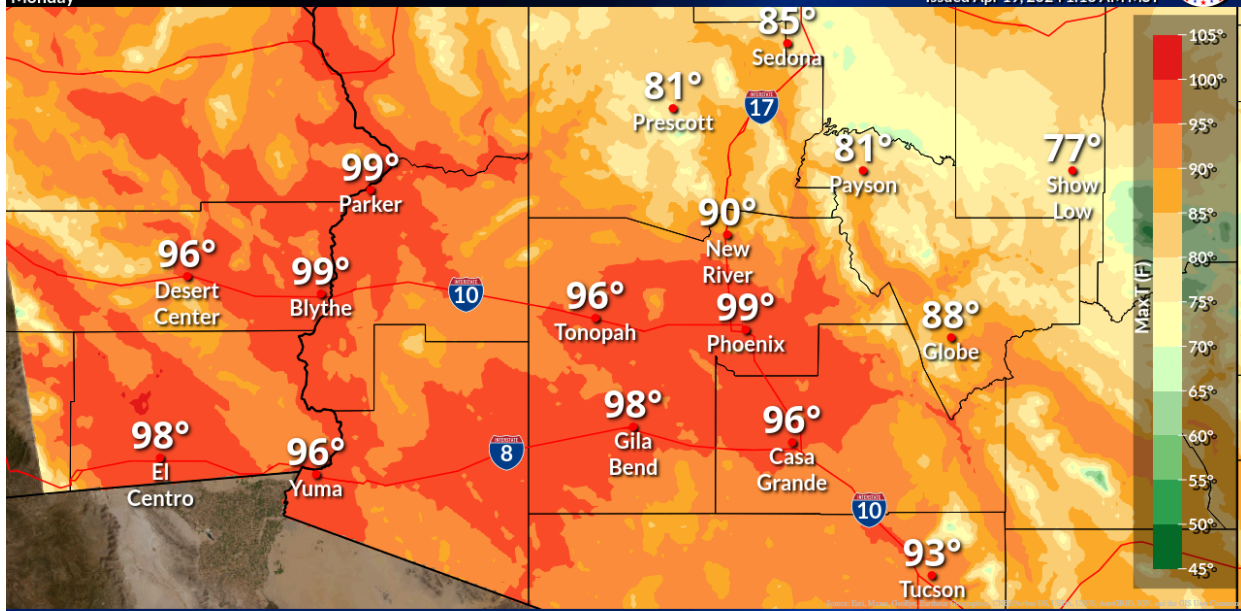
