



Hot Temperatures Continue This Week Resulting in a Minor to locally Moderate HeatRisk

KEY POINTS

- Widespread triple digit heat continues through this weekend.
Localized areas of Moderate HeatRisk, highest coverage today and Friday.
Dry conditions prevail.

WEATHER RISK OUTLOOK

Risk levels incorporate potential impacts from weather hazards and likelihood of occurrence. The weather hazard with the greatest risk will be listed first in the matrix.

High Terrain SC AZ

**Impacts:**

Minor Risk for heat-related illnesses for those extremely sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Daily

- Highs in the mid 90s each afternoon

Southwest Arizona

**Impacts:**

Minor Risk for heat-related illnesses for those extremely sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Moderate Risk today, Friday, and Saturday.

- Highs topping out between 100-105 degrees each afternoon

Southeast California

**Impacts:**

Moderate Risk for heat-related illnesses for pets, livestock, and those who are sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Moderate Risk through this weekend

- Highs topping out between 100-106 degrees each afternoon

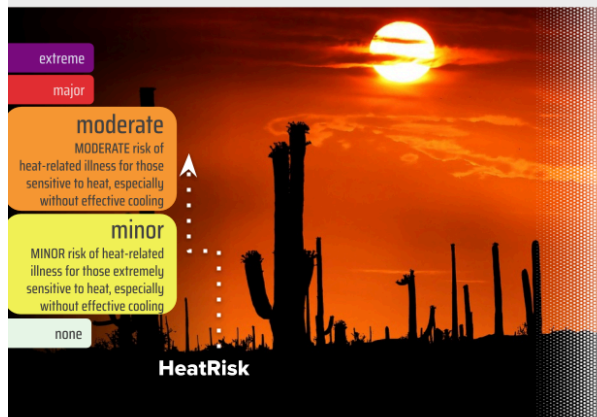
