- Increased and expanded thunderstorm risk in SW Arizona and SE California today
- Lowered thunderstorm risk and impacts Wednesday due to increased forecast uncertainty

Phoenix Metropolitan

Impacts:

Moderate Risk for heat-related illnesses for pets, livestock, and those who are sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Through Friday

Details:

- High temperatures 105-112°F
- Overnight lows 80-92°F



Impacts:

Strong gusty winds, lightning, and locally heavy rainfall

Timing:

Moderate risk today in far NW Maricopa Co; Minor otherwise

Details:

- Today: 50% chance of storms in NW Maricopa Co, 20-30% elsewhere
- In NW Maricopa County, with better than a 70% chance of wind gusts over 35 mph and 5% chance of gusts over 58 mph
- Tuesday-Friday: Storm chances 20-40% with uncertainty on any day with greater impacts

Higher Terrain SC AZ



Impacts:

Moderate Risk for heat-related illnesses for pets, livestock, and those who are sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Minor: Today-Tuesday; Moderate: Wednesday-Friday

Details:

• Highs 90-105°



Impacts:

Strong gusty winds, lightning, and locally heavy rainfall

Timing:

Moderate: Tuesday, otherwise Minor

Details:

• Storm chances primarily 30-70% with better odds of storm impacts Tuesday

Southwest Arizona Impacts: Major Risk for heat-related illnesses for pets, livestock, and much of the population, especially with extended outdoor exposure, and for those who are heat sensitive and/or without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration. Timing: Through Friday **Details:** • Excessive Heat Warning in effect through Friday for the city of Yuma Highs temperatures 105-112°F with higher heat index in Yuma Overnight lows in the 80s Impacts: Strong gusty winds, lightning and locally heavy rainfall Timing: Moderate Today; Minor otherwise **Thunderstorms** Details: Storm chances up to 50% today over La Paz County with better than a 70% chance of wind gusts over 35 mph and 5% chance of gusts over 58 mph • Chances 10-40% Tuesday-Friday Impacts: Reduced visibility in dense blowing dust Timing: - Blowing Dust This afternoon and evening primarily in La Paz County Details: • 50% chance for locally dense blowing dust resulting in dangerous traveling conditions

Southeast California Impacts:



Major Risk for heat-related illnesses for pets, livestock, and much of the population, especially with extended outdoor exposure, and for those who are heat sensitive and/or without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Through Friday

Details:

- Excessive Heat Warning in effect through Friday
- Highs 100-115°F with peak heat indices around 120°F
- Overnight lows middle 80s to near 90 degrees



Impacts:

Strong gusty winds, lightning and locally heavy rainfall

Timing:

Through Wednesday

Details:

Storm chances 10-30%, mainly in Riverside County

Blowing Dust

Impacts:


Reduced visibility in dense blowing dust

Timing

Late this afternoon and evening far eastern Riverside County

Details:

• 30% chance for locally dense blowing dust resulting in dangerous traveling conditions


