



Quiet Weather Today | More Unsettled Weather Tuesday-Wednesday Followed by Cooler temperatures Mid to Late week

KEY POINTS

- No weather impacts today with dry weather continuing and above normal temperatures with highs in the low 70s across the lower deserts.
- A stronger weather system will likely bring breezy to locally windy conditions Tuesday and Wednesday along with some precipitation chances, especially across the AZ high terrain.
- Temperatures cool down to near to slightly below normal levels by mid week and continue through the weekend, with low temperatures in some of the colder rural areas dipping down to near to below freezing.

CHANGES FROM PREVIOUS BRIEFING

- Increased the wind risk from Minor to Moderate for Southeast CA and Joshua Tree National Park on Tuesday and Wednesday.
- Added blowing dust to Southeast CA on Tuesday and Wednesday.
- Added light rain showers to the Phoenix Metro and NW Pinal County for Tuesday and Wednesday.

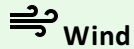

Bring in sensitive plants & take precautions to protect other property from freezing temperatures.

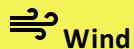
Timing:

Starting Thursday

Details:

- Multiple days of early morning low temperatures near to below freezing across portions of northwest Pinal County-especially the Casa Grande and Arizona City areas.

Wind

Impacts:

Loose or unsecured objects may be blown away.

Timing:

Wednesday

Details:

- Peak wind gusts in excess of 30 mph possible.



Freeze

Impacts:

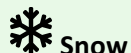
Bring in sensitive plants & take precautions to protect other property from freezing temperatures.

Timing:

Starting Thursday

Details:

- Multiple days of early morning low temperatures near to below freezing, including the Globe/Miami and San Carlos areas.



Snow

Impacts:

Slick roads and minor travel delays possible.

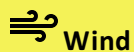
Timing:

Wednesday

Details:

- Snow showers above 3000-3500 feet with very minor accumulations of less than one inch.

Loose or unsecured objects may be blown away.

Timing:

Tuesday and Wednesday

Details:

- Peak wind gusts in excess of 30 mph possible.

Southeast CA



Impacts:

Loose or unsecured objects may be blown away.

Timing:

Tuesday and Wednesday

Details:

- Northerly winds 20-30 mph with wind gusts up to 55 mph possible.

Impacts:

Loose or unsecured objects may be blown away.

Timing:

Tuesday and Wednesday

Details:

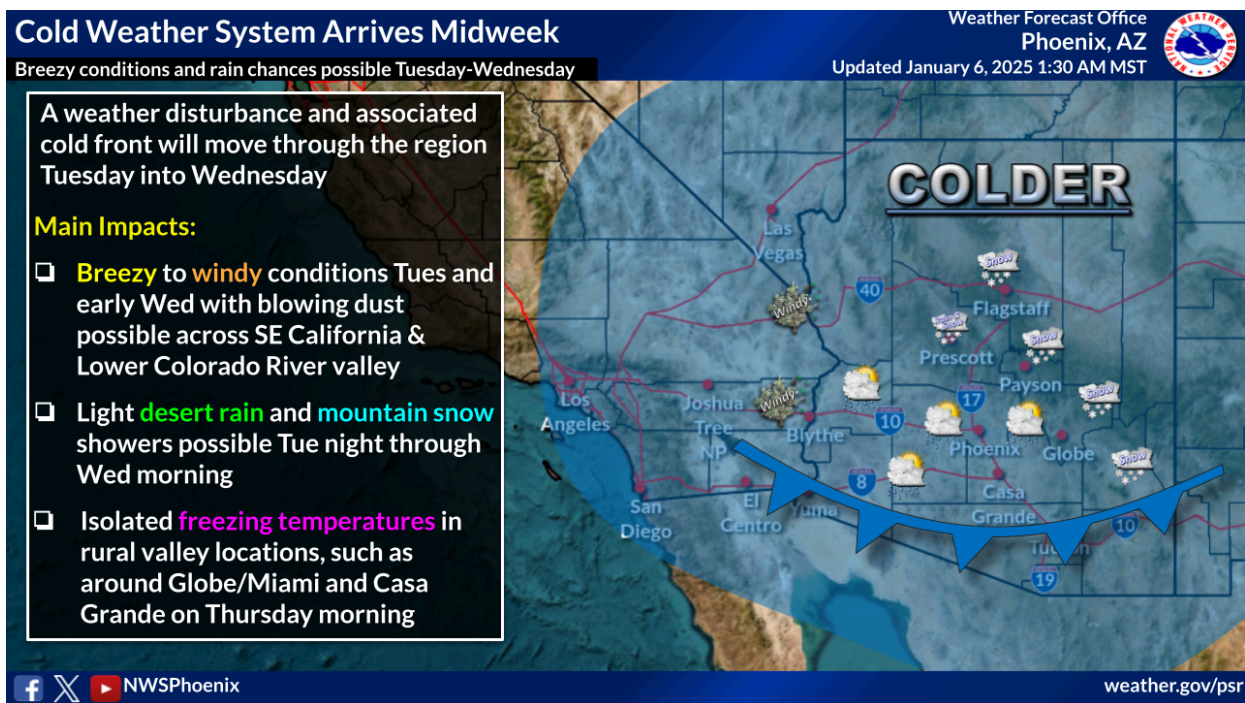
- Northerly winds 20-30 mph with wind gusts up to 55 mph possible.

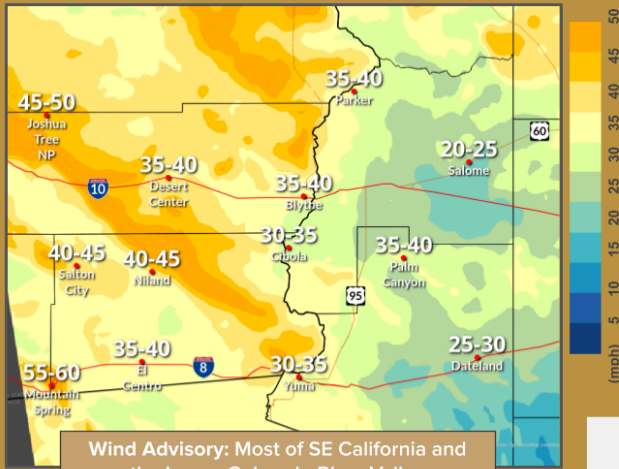
