Arizona Indian Education Association (AIEA) 2024-2025 Student Scholarship Application Form

The scholarship recognizes American Indian students who demonstrate exemplary academic achievement, community service, and leadership and consistently participate in cultural activities. The AIEA Student Scholarship aims to promote, encourage, and support students as they develop into scholars and prepare to engage in important careers as adults.

This year's scholarship theme is **strengthening self-determination**. AIEA defines self-determination as creating your path that supports and strengthens yourself, your family, your community, or your tribe.

Applicant Criteria:

- American Indian/Alaska Native students residing in **and** attending a school or community college/university in Arizona.
- Enrolled member of a federally-recognized tribal nation
- Demonstrates excellence, creativity, initiative, and leadership in school, community and cultural activities
- Exemplifies the characteristics of a positive role model in his/her/their school and community

<u>9th – 12th Grade Students:</u>

• Must have a 2.0 GPA or above

<u>Community College/University Students:</u>

- Must be enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student with a minimum of 12 credit hours for the current semester
- Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or above

Graduate Students:

- Must be enrolled as a full-time graduate student with minimum credit hours, as defined by the graduate program, for the current semester. (Provide documentation from graduate college/department)
- Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or above

Application Procedure:

- 1. Complete the application form.
- 2. Submit a copy of tribal enrollment card/CIB from a federally-recognized Indian Nation.
- 3. Please include two (2) current letters of recommendation (letters should be dated in 2024/2025) from a teacher/professor, counselor/advisor, mentor, church leader, or community leader. The recommendation should include cultural aspects and highlights of the students.
- 4. Submit a copy of your current school transcripts. Unofficial copies are acceptable.

- 5. Submit a typed double-spaced essay (at least two pages, 12-point font) on the theme of **"What responsibility do you hold in strengthening self-determination?"** Please do the following:
 - a. Create a questionnaire with four questions that you will use to interview a Native elder that your community considers to be an elder.
 - b. Interview the Native Elder using your questionnaire. This can be someone you know or someone you meet just for this assignment. Ask the elder if they can teach you a word or concept in their native language for **Self-Determination**.
 - c. Write your essay. Explain the importance of **Self-Determination** in learning, knowing, and appreciating the role of culture in your educational journey.
- 6. Submit a curriculum vitae or resume with the following information:
 - a. Education and Career Objective (one sentence)
 - b. Awards received
 - c. Student government or leadership positions
 - d. Extracurricular activities (i.e., clubs, sports, community organizations, etc.)
 - e. Job Experience
 - f. Volunteer Experience
- 7. **College/University students**: Submit a copy of enrollment verification from the college/university office.

8. OPTIONAL ARTISTIC EXPRESSION PIECE:

- a. Create a piece of artistic expression, creative expression, or performative art. (extra 10 points)
- b. All mediums are welcome, including paper, canvas, clay, and digital art, including pictures and videos up to three minutes long.
- c. Submit a digital copy of your art piece via email with your application.
- d. If an art piece is in question, please email <u>aiea.est2003@gmail.com</u>.
- e. If you want to submit your art piece for the AIEA Educators Celebration's silent auction, please email <u>aiea.est2003@gmail.com</u>.

Deadline:

- Applications must be completed and received by **February 1, 2025**, by mail or email.
- Awardees must attend at least one AIEA general meeting in the 2025-26 school year.
- All awardees will be invited to the **June 2025** AIEA Student Recognition Meeting to be recognized.
- The Scholarship Review Committee will notify the awardees by **February 24, 2025**.
